



# Bachelor of Ministry: Post-Professional

The Bachelor of Ministry (BMin) is designed to form character and develop skills in women and men called by God, enabling them to serve as reflective practitioners in the church of Jesus Christ.

In keeping with the University College mission and in support of its educational philosophy, this degree serves students who have completed a professional post-secondary diploma at least two years in length from an approved institution. This program is designed to equip the learner with knowledge and competencies essential for effective leadership and ministry in a variety of pastoral positions.

## Program Planning Guide

### GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- A cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of at least 2.0 is required to graduate, with a GPA of at least 2.0 in all Christian Studies (REL) and Professional Studies (PST) courses.
