Phase One of the new Ambrose University College campus is almost finished. Faculty and staff will begin moving out of over-crowded leased space in August. On September 8, 2008, the doors will open to the first group of students.

The projected costs of this bold new step in our story are \$36 million. We have cash and revenue commitments (including possible sale of 4 acres) of \$21.95 million, and a planned mortgage of \$10 million. We still need to raise a minimum of \$4.05 million. Any amount beyond that will help reduce our mortgage and expand our educational offerings.
